This event, on the use of information and communication technologies (ICTs) to promote human rights, will follow the presentation by the Special Rapporteur on extrajudicial, summary or arbitrary executions of his report on the use of ICTs for the protection of the right to life.

The discussion is intended to sensitise those working at the Human Rights Council to the potential of this dynamic and growing field, with which official international mechanisms need to engage. It will also offer an opportunity for participants to highlight the challenges presented by new technologies and to consider the limitations of digital human rights work.
